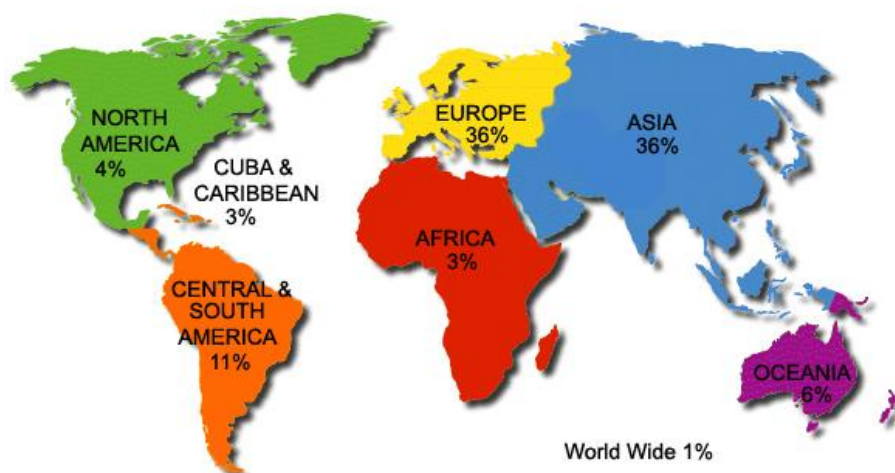


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# INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTIONAL AGREEMENTS

Brock continues to expand its partnerships with reputable educational institutions around the world. During this annual report year, from July 1, 2011 – June 30, 2012, 12 new agreements were signed and 3 were renewed. To date, Brock University has formal agreements with 135 partner institutions from 45 different countries. ## **VISITING INTERNATIONAL PROFESSORS (VIP), SCHOLARS (VIS), AND UNIVERSITY MENTORSHIP (UM) PARTICIPANTS**

### **Visiting International Professor Program (VIP)**

Brock's Visiting International Professor (VIP) program brings visiting faculty from academic institutions in other nations to visit Brock for one or two terms teaching one or more courses in their area of expertise, as well as collaborating with Brock faculty and students in a range of other academic and research activities. VIPs do not receive a faculty salary but may be paid the appropriate course stipend per course that they teach.

### **Visiting International Scholar Program (VIS)**

Brock's Visiting International Scholar (VIS) program invites visiting scholars and researchers from abroad who are interested in an international research and scholarship opportunity to visit Brock for a specific period of time, ranging from as short as a few weeks to more typically one year. Visiting scholars collaborate with Brock faculty and students in a wide range of academic and scholarly activities while they are here.

### **University Mentorship Program (UM)**

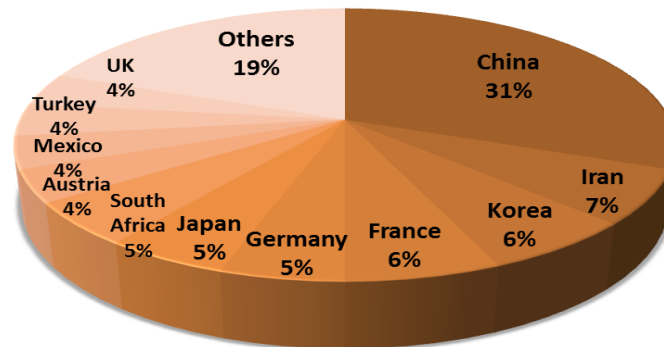
The University Mentorship (UM) program welcomes visiting, faculty, students and staff members from academic institutions in other nations to visit Brock for an extended period, to interact and collaborate with Brock faculty, students and staff in a range of academic and administrative professional development activities, including graduate and undergraduate laboratory internships and research work under the supervision of a Brock faculty member and/or jointly supervised with the home academic institution.

#### **VIP/VIS/UM Program Statistics**

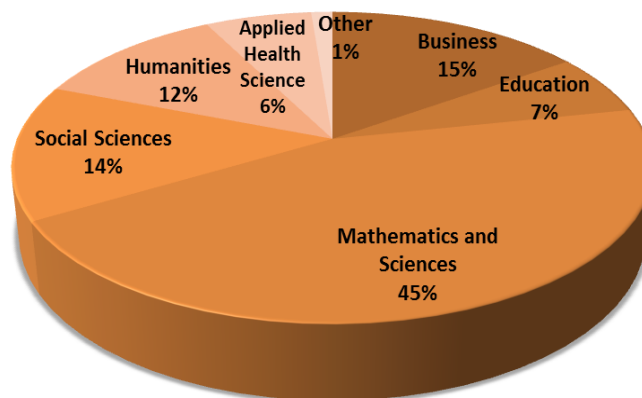
- During the period July 1, 2011 – June 30, 2012, there were 78 participants from 25 countries in the visiting scholar programs

## VIP/VIS/UM Participation Distribution in 2011/12

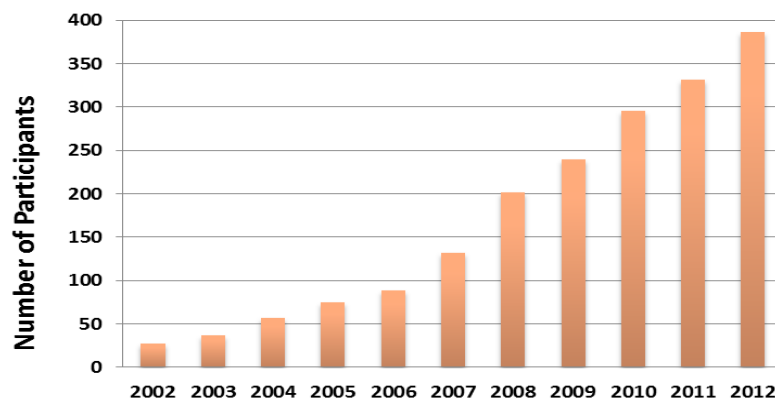
### Country of Origin
