

STUDY TRAVEL HISTORY COURSES: JUNE 2013
HIST3M51 – Modern Latin America in its Cities: Bogotá (Colombia)

Political, social, economic, cultural, and environmental history of Latin America from 1825 to the present through a country approach, the city of Bogotá as its microcosm, in counterpoint with Mexico City; themes include memory; environment; migration, architecture; class, race, and gender in the city; the urban grid and communication networks; and street art.

Intensive 4-week study period in Bogotá, jointly with students and faculty from a local university. Course includes background preparation prior to departure (5 hours) and Guest Speaker presentations, lectures, seminars, and field trips in Bogotá (67 hours). This is a full credit course.

During their 4-week stay in Bogotá, students will be taken on field trips, including archeological sites, libraries and archives, national and art museums, urban wetlands, architectural landmarks, transportation systems, among other sites. Students will be given days and half-days off during which they can read, work on course assignments, visit other museums and historical sites, or just sit in local cafés and experience *Bogotano* life.

All students who register in the course will receive an automatic \$250 Student International Mobility Award from Brock University, which is deducted from tuition for the course.

Note: Students are responsible for paying for their passport fees and photos, flights, transportation to and from international airports, accommodation, travel insurance, food, local transportation, museum admission fees, spending money and incidentals, and field trip costs. (Some of the additional costs, such as admissions to various museums, may be covered by external funding to which application will be made by the instructors).
