## Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) Town Hall Meeting

Take this opportunity to be part of the consultation process, for revisions to the new suite of research programs and the peer review process of Open Operating Programs within CIHR. Over the past year CIHR has engaged the research community, partners, and other stakeholders to aid in the redesign of its open suite of research programs and peer review process. Details of the program reforms are detailed in "[CIHR Design Discussion](#)"

[Document: Proposed Changes to CIHR's Open Suite of Programs and Enhancements to the Peer Review Process](#)". Specifically, the reforms seek to address:

- Gaps in program accessibility and complexity
- Insufficient support for new investigators and applicant burden
- Lack of reviewer expertise and inconsistent reviews
- High peer reviewer workload

CIHR has reviewed and analyzed feedback collected from a series of community consultations, web-based discussions and anonymous comments, and documented the results in "[What CIHR Heard: Analysis of Feedback on the Design and Discussion Document](#)".

Dr. Jane Aubin, Chief Scientific Officer and Vice President of Research for CIHR, will be visiting McMaster University to provide stakeholders with the latest information from CIHR on upcoming policy changes, including revisions to the introduction of the open suite of CIHR programs and peer review processes, and to address further questions or concerns regarding these changes.

This continuing consultative process seeks to further develop and refine the open suite program design. CIHR thanks the research community, partners and other stakeholders for their feedback and recognizes that more work is necessary before implementing changes.

- **NEW! IMPORTANT!** The [NSERC CCV template](#) is now available and applies only to the Notification of Intent for Discovery Grants, full application for Discovery Grants, and the Subatomic Physics Grants suite for now. [Instructions](#) for completing the NSERC CCV are also on-line. The NSERC CCV replaces Form 100.

If you are planning to submit a DG application this fall, you should register as soon as possible with CCV. If you already have a CCV account, note that the architecture was changed summer 2012, so you will need to verify information that was migrated from the old system. Anticipate that preparation of your CCV will take longer than you think.

- NSERC is launching a new **Research Portal**, which will be used for the upcoming **Discovery Grant (DG)** competition (including the DG Notification of Intent, deadline August 1) and applications to the Collaborative Research and Development (CRD) program. Applicants to all programs other than DG and CRD, for example the Research Tools and Instruments program, will continue to use the old NSERC On-line System for now. All NSERC programs will be migrated to the new portal by late 2015.

- **Discovery Grants (DG)**. Notification of Intent deadline: **Thursday, August 1, 2013**. Application deadline: **Friday, November 1, 2013**. **Both NOIs and applications must be submitted through the new Research Portal (available soon)**. The application will require the [Canadian Common CV \(CCV\)](#) (NSERC format) instead of Form 100. (See above.)

- **Research Tools and Instruments (RTI)**. **Brock University has a quota of three (3) RTI proposals** in the upcoming fall competition. Over the past few years we have submitted six to twelve RTI applications per competition. We are currently working on an internal process for determining which ones to put forward. Research within the CCNA will be organized around three themes: primary prevention - aimed at preventing the disease from developing; secondary prevention - focused on delaying the clinical manifestations of the already developing disease; and quality of life - designed for helping individuals, caregivers and the health system in the context of a clinically developed disease. Applicants are expected to submit an Expression of Interest that describes the whole Consortium including components of training, ethics, legal, and social implications. Applicants are also expected to expand on knowledge translation, shared resources, governance, as well as the teams planned within each theme of the Consortium with their research program.

This ongoing program provides funding for Canadian universities to host US scholars for two to six weeks to lecture and work with colleagues.

• **Digging into Data Challenge - an international research funding opportunity.** The Digging into Data Challenge aims to address how "big data" changes the research landscape for the humanities and social sciences. As the world becomes increasingly digital, new techniques will be needed to search, analyze, and understand these materials. For this third competition, the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) and the Canada Foundation for Innovation (CFI) have joined SSHRC to fund Canadian teams. Each project is an international partnership among two to four national teams, from at least two of the four participating countries (Canada, the

Netherlands, the US, and the UK). When a project is selected for funding, each of the teams will receive a grant from their respective country. For Canadian teams, the maximum award amount (over two years) will range from:

- up to \$125,000 for projects requesting funds from SSHRC only; or
- for multidisciplinary teams requesting funds from SSHRC and NSERC, a maximum of \$125,000 from each agency can be requested. Note: each agency will only fund research in accordance with its respective mandate).
- CFI is also making funds of \$500,000 available for Canadian teams towards specific infrastructure needed to enable the Canadian research team(s) to achieve their research objectives.

Final applications will be due May 15, 2013.
