

Courses to Keep in Mind for Fourth Year: DART 3F99/P97/P98 Advanced Project Courses and DART 4F94 Honours Thesis

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Students who have a high standing and have shown particular flair in a certain area of study may apply for a special studies course, called a "3F99" (full credit) or a "3P97" or a "3P98" (half credit). There are specific guidelines to be followed for this:

DART 3F99 Advanced Project in Dramatic Arts

Advanced study in an area of mutual interest to the student and the instructor.

Restriction: permission of a faculty supervisor.

Note: a written proposal must be approved by the Department before registration.

DART 3P97 Advanced Project in Dramatic Arts I

Advanced study in any area of mutual interest to the student and the instructor.

Restriction: permission of a faculty supervisor.

Note: a written proposal must be approved by the Department before registration.

Materials fee may be required. May occur off campus. Students are expected to pay their own expenses.

DART 3P98 Advanced Project in Dramatic Arts II

Advanced study in an area of mutual interest to the student and instructor.

Restriction: permission of a faculty supervisor.

Prerequisite(s): DART 3P97.

Note: a written proposal must be approved by the Department before registration.

Completion of this course will replace previous assigned grade and credit obtained in DART 3V95.

The material to be studied should not duplicate an existing course, rather it should provide an opportunity for additional exploration in an area of mutual interest to the student and participating instructor. This may also include production experience with local theatre companies.

Students must submit a written application to a supervising faculty member and the Course Coordinator. The application should outline the objectives, the material to be studied, the resources, theories and practices to be undertaken and expected outcomes. Once approved the course outline template will be completed by the student, the course faculty and the course coordinator. Please ask the department for an application form.

NOTE: Like all courses you must plan adequate time to successfully complete this type of course. In order to approve the project, the Course Coordinator must decide that both the student and the instructor have sufficient time to undertake the projected course-- especially the instructor, who must teach the course above and beyond his/her regular teaching load.

NOTE: students who are cast in mainstage productions, or who are accepted as Assistants to the Director or Designer (such as stage managers, dramaturge etc.) may apply for a 3P97 credit for this work, although these courses are not guaranteed to be offered every year

DART 4F94 Honours Thesis Project

Critical, historical, production and/or creative project in dramatic arts of mutual interest to the student, the supervising instructor and/or Department.

Restriction: students must have a minimum 75 percent major average and permission of the Chair.

Prerequisite(s): DART 4F90 (may be taken concurrently).

Note: a written proposal must be approved by the Department before registration.

Materials fee may be required.

Students with appropriate academic standing may propose to undertake DART 4F94 honors thesis in their fourth year. The student will prepare a proposal and consult with faculty and the chair to determine a primary supervisor. A second reader may also be required.
